High LNG Prices Are Here To Stay

In just one year, the global market of liquefied natural gas (LNG) turned from a buyer's market to a seller's market, with LNG suppliers commanding a tight market as buyers scramble to secure gas from providers other than Russia. The European Union's target to diversify gas supplies, speed up the roll-out of renewable gases, and replace gas in heating and power generation in hopes of cutting EU demand for Russian gas by two-thirds before the end of the year has created a global race for spot LNG supply. In this race for LNG supplies, Europe is currently winning over Asia, the traditional outlet for most of the global spot supply. This has not been the case for several months now, even before the Russian invasion of Ukraine, as Europe was plunged into an energy crisis in the autumn of 2021 with low levels of gas... Growing calls for US LNG revive stalled export projects...

Rising demand for U.S. liquefied natural gas (LNG) as buyers shun Russian fuel is putting some long-stalled U.S. export projects back on track. But rising material and labor costs threaten to rumble again at these factories. Two developers with projects shelved due to the US-China trade war – Energy Transfer with its Lake Charles LNG and Tellurian Inc with its Driftwood LNG – have started discussions with construction supplier Bechtel Group over costs, according to a spokesperson and a regulatory filing. Material prices have soared 20% in the past two years, while gas compressors are 30% more expensive, construction and energy experts said. U.S. Refiners Set for Strong Start to 2022 as Fuel Prices Surge Worldwide

U.S. oil refiners expect strong first-quarter earnings as margins to sell gasoline and diesel strengthened due to a steep dropoff in refining capacity and crude oil supplies tightened because of Russia's war with Ukraine. Refining capacity worldwide has dropped during the coronavirus pandemic, with several less profitable oil refineries closing in the last two years. However, worldwide fuel demand has rebounded to near prepandemic levels, boosting profits for facilities that are still operating. Seven U.S. independent refining companies are projected to post earnings-per-share of 61 cents, compared with a loss of \$1.32 in first quarter of 2021, according to IBES data from Refinitiv. 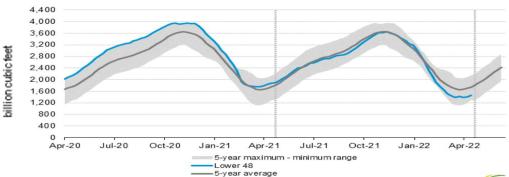

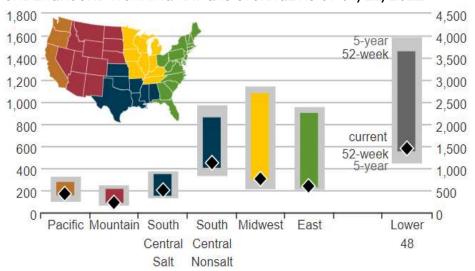

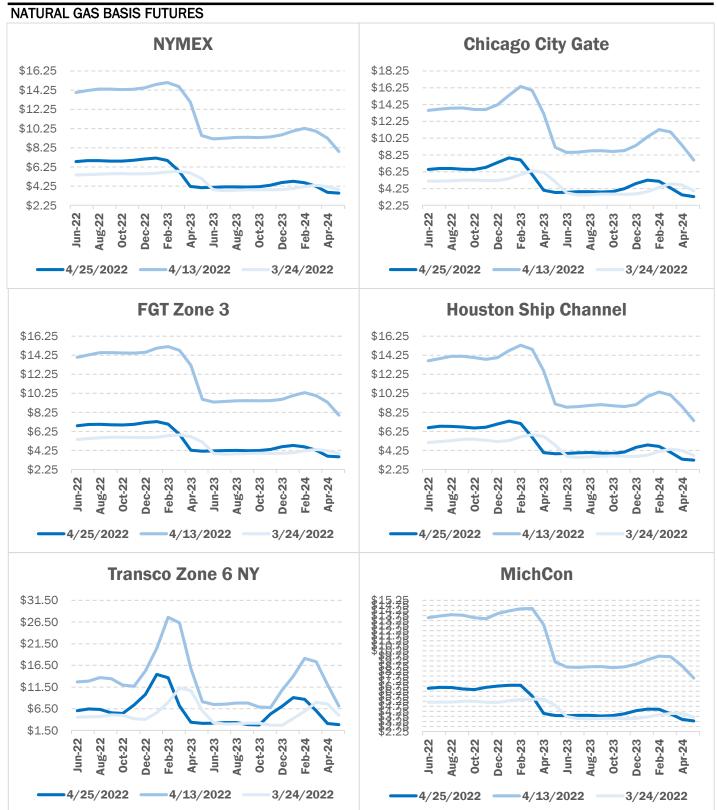
