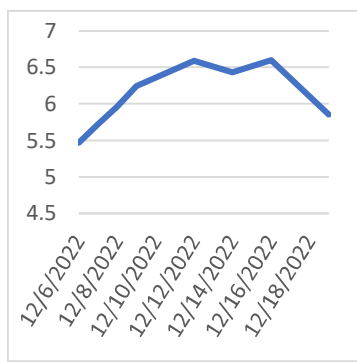

U.S. poised to become net exporter of crude oil in 2023

The United States has become a global crude oil exporting power over the last few years, but exports have not exceeded its imports since World War II. That could change next year. Sales of U.S. crude to other nations are now a record 3.4 million barrels per day (bpd), with exports of about 3 million bpd of refined products like gasoline and diesel fuel. The United States is also the leading liquefied natural gas (LNG) exporter, where growth is expected to soar in coming years. But the United States consumes 20 million barrels of crude a day, the most in the world, and its output has never exceeded 13 million bpd. Until recently, the idea that it would be anything but a big crude importer was folly. Natural Gas Price Fundamental Daily Forecast

Natural gas futures are trading higher late in the session on Thursday after reversing earlier weakness. The catalysts behind the market's strength are a bigger than expected storage draw in today's government report, an increase in gas flows to liquefied natural gas (LNG) export plants and a drop in output as extreme cold from North Dakota to Texas caused oil and gas wells to freeze. At 19:40 GMT, March natural gas futures are trading \$5.792, up \$0.172 or +3.06%. The United States Natural Gas Fund ETF (UNG) is at \$20.90, up \$1.43 or +7.34%. The U.S. Energy Information Administration (EIA) reported a draw of 50 billion cubic feet (Bcf) of gas from storage during the week-ended December 9, exceeding the 45 Bcf decline analysts forecast in a Reuters poll and compared with a decrease of 83 Bc... Even with one facility closed, U.S. LNG exports improve

Even though the United States is down one export facility, federal data show that total LNG deliveries have improved from week-ago levels. Natural gas deliveries from inland shale basins to U.S. LNG export terminals increased by 4% from week-ago levels to 12.4 billion cubic feet per day (Bcf/d) on average. Most of the added volume went to terminals in Louisiana, such as Sempra Energy's facility in Cameron County, La. The Sabine Pass terminal in Texas, however, was the busiest one last week, with nine vessels laden with LNG departing for foreign shores. Cameron sent out five, while four left from Corpus Christi, three departed Calcasieu Pass in Louisiana and two sailed from the Cove Point facility off Maryland. 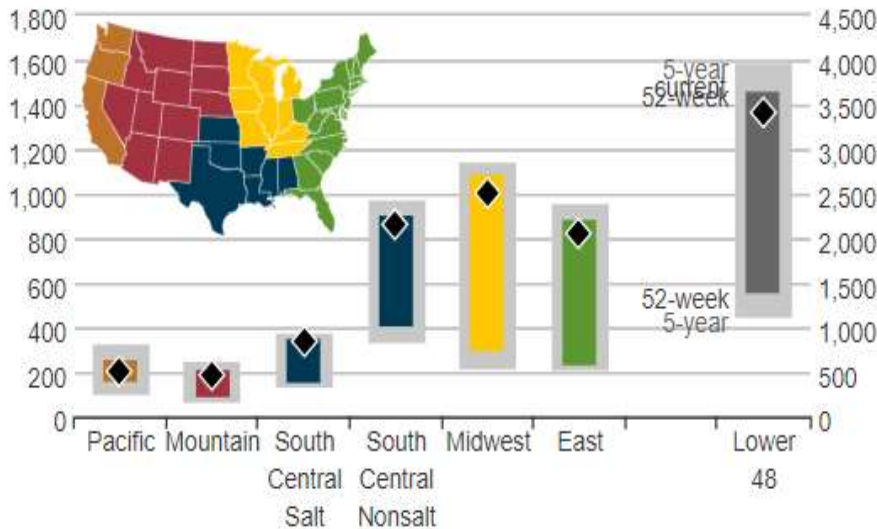

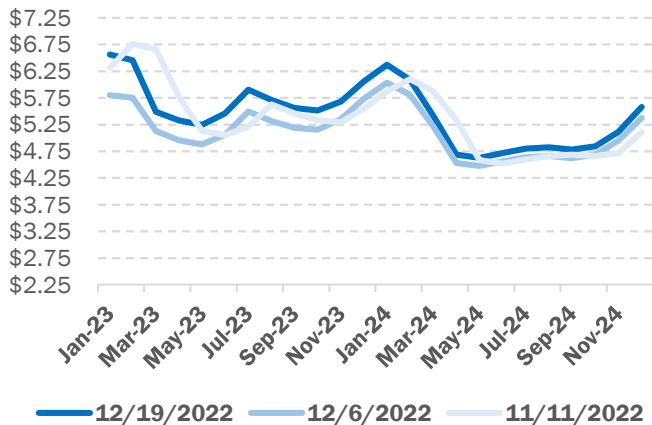
