### Georgia consumers likely to see higher natural gas, electricity bills

Waves of price increases are expected to douse many Georgians who pay electricity and natural gas bills in the coming months. One crucial reason: surging prices for natural gas that heat homes, water, stoves and ovens. Utilities also rely heavily on burning natural gas to generate electricity. Adding to the consumer burden, state regulators already have approved an electricity rate increase for Georgia Power and are considering beginning to allow some charges for construction costs at the long-troubled nuclear expansion of Plant Vogtle. Georgia Power's moves alone could hit its 2.6 million customers with more than \$600 million in extra costs over the next nine months or so, with more to come later. Typical residential electric bills could rise \$10.46 a month, or \$125.52 over a full year. More than a fourth of the ... For more info go to <https://bit.ly/3vpfwtD>

### Brent oil futures mark first loss in 3 sessions; natural-gas prices end at a

Oil futures took a split path on Monday, with the global benchmark ending lower for the first time in three sessions and the U.S. benchmark significantly paring early gains after both touched multiyear highs. The lofty prices for crude raised the potential for demand destruction in the energy market, an analyst said. Natural-gas prices, meanwhile, fell by nearly 8% on Monday, as a forecast for warmer weather helped to ease worries about winter energy supplies. The oil market is likely to see an increase in volatility because of the recent multiyear highs for prices, said Phil Flynn, senior market analyst at The Price Futures Group. ### Russia chooses not to raise natural gas supplies to Europe despite Putin's

LONDON — Russia has opted against sending more natural gas supplies to Europe, curbing hopes that Moscow may ease its grip on the market shortly after President Vladimir Putin said the country would be prepared to help. Highly anticipated auction results on Monday showed Russia's state gas giant Gazprom had not booked additional gas transit capacity for November either through the Ukrainian pipeline system or lines into western Europe via Poland. Gazprom booked only 30 million cubic meters per day on the Yamal-Europe route of 86.5 million cubic meters per day available for November, an amount comparable to that booked in September, and has not booked any volumes via Ukraine. The auction results are regarded as a key signal to the market of upcoming volumes because they take place two to three weeks prior to the mo... For more info go to <https://cnb.cx/3jiDa66>



## WEEKLY GAS IN UNDERGROUND STORAGE WITH 5-YR RANGE




